US Proposed Update to package material requirement TPCH to Include Phthalates and PFAS

On July 9, 2020, the Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse (TPCH) announced it was seeking comments on the organization's draft update to their Toxics in Packaging Model Legislation. The update includes the addition of PFAS and phthalates as regulated chemicals. The comment period will be open until August 24, 2020.

Current restricted substances and the proposed adding substances are as below:
